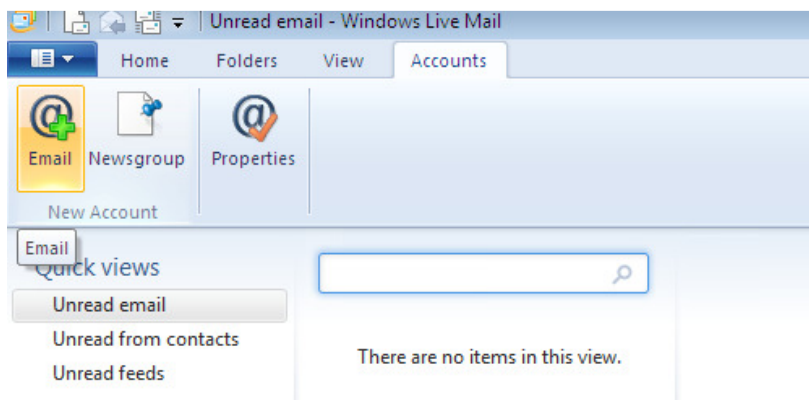


Setting up Silomail on Windows Live Mail

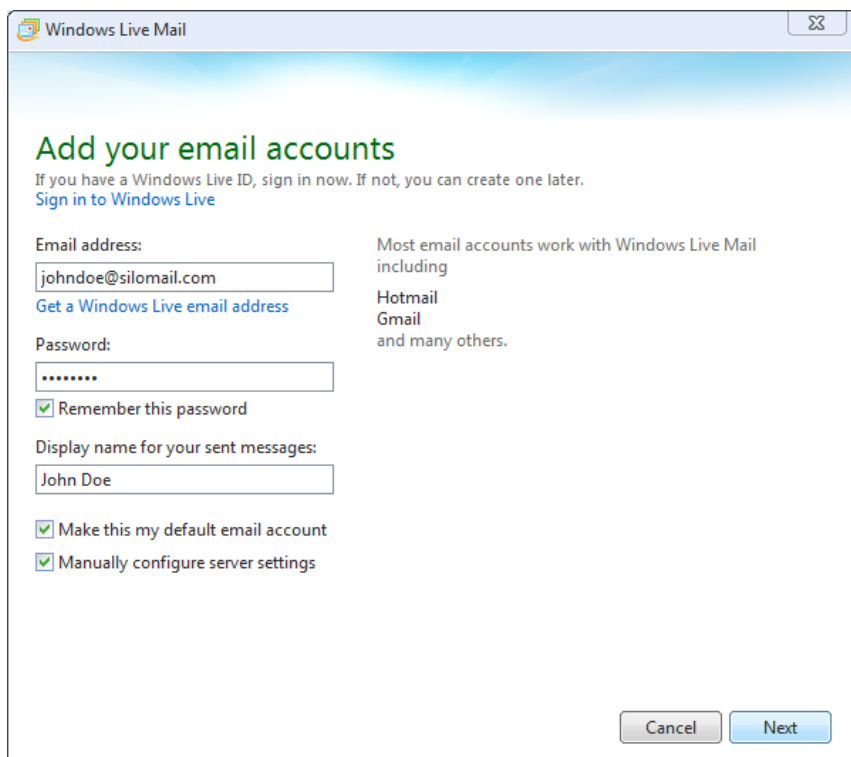
Note: When Windows Live Mail was first introduced it did not work with pop3 based e-mail addresses (such as Silomail). Since then Windows has updated the program to address this issue.

Open Windows Live Mail and follow the below instructions to set up your Silomail.com e-mail address.

1. Click on the “Accounts” tab along the top of the program, then click the “Email” button.




2. Once you’ve clicked “Email” a new window will pop up. Enter your account information as represented below. Make sure to check the box next to “Manually configure server settings”. Once complete, click “Next”.





3. Your unique logon user name should be automatically entered (it should be the first part of your Silomail.com e-mail address, not including “@silomail.com”). Enter the rest of the server settings to match the below picture exactly. Once complete, click “Next”.
